




New Website coming soon

This will contain all of our school information for parents to use.



Impetigo—School sores

We have had a case of School Sores (Impetigo) in our Junior school. These present as blisters with a yellow crust which are

normally itchy on the face, hands and legs.

If suspected please make an appointment to see your GP and keep your children away from school until the sores are completely dry and are not weeping anymore.

School sores are easily passed between adults and children so good hygiene is important as well as discourag-

ing scratching and touching the affected areas to decrease the risk of spreading them.
